

## Annual report 2017 Quina Care Foundation

Quina Care is a Dutch foundation that was founded in January 2017 by two Dutch doctors specialized in Tropical Medicine, Jacob van der Ende and Carolien van der Ende-Bouwman, with a primary aim to offer medical care in the rural Amazon rainforest of South America where, until this day, there is no accessible good medical care. As current developmental aid is most often focused in Africa, the problems in South America are often overlooked. As is the case in Africa, South America deals with substantial poverty, violence and the lack of high quality health care.

### 2017

In 2017, there was a strong focus on the administrative establishment of the Quina Care Foundation. This includes (but is not limited to) the request and obtainment of the ANBI-status from the Dutch tax services, as well as the creation of a website.

To some extent there has been development in the name recognition of Quina Care within its own network of the board and the two doctors that are involved. This has led to a limited number of regular contributors and some incidental gifts. A 'periodic gift' agreement has been made with the regular contributors by which their gifts will be fully tax deductible.

## **2018**

A former boarding school has been found in Puerto el Carmen del Putumayo in Ecuador which allows for the establishment of a basic hospital. The owner, the bishop of the province where Puerto el Carmen is situated, has made the building available to us through a commodate. Quina Care aims to provide with this hospital good primary and emergency secondary health care for the local community, including emergency surgeries.

In the meantime, the Quina Care Foundation has been established in Ecuador as well. From 1 August 2018 onwards, Jacob and Carolien van der Ende will, together with a local contractor, start the renovation of the former boarding school in Puerto el Carmen, into a hospital with, among other things, delivery rooms, operating room and emergency department.

Additionally, there will be an outpatient clinic with radiology, clinical laboratory and pharmacy. Furthermore, facilities will be constructed that will allow for the admission of patients. The objective is to have the hospital up and running within a year.

To be ready for opening the costs of the renovation and refurbishment of the hospital are estimated at € 475.000. Thereafter, in order for the hospital to be operational the yearly costs are estimated at € 315.000. Patients will be asked to make a small contribution to the costs.

In 2018 Quina Care will continue to work on increasing its name recognition and the acquisition of funds for both the renovation and the start-up of the hospital, as well as ensuring contributors for financing the yearly costs. The existence of Quina Care will be introduced and presented to a wider public through [quinacare.org](http://quinacare.org) and social media. Businesses, organisations and private individuals will be approached actively with the request for a one-time gift or a regular contribution. If desired, this can be supported by, presentations, (edited) videos or other resources that illustrate the activities of Quina Care. For all these recruiting efforts, there will be a critical approach to the necessary costs, in order for the gifts and funds to be used as much as possible for the realisation of the objective.

This annual report is constructed by Yvonne van der Ende, treasurer of Quina Care Foundation on 7 May 2018 and approved during the board meeting on 9 May 2018.
